Evaluation of Social Welfare Department Grant in Aid Schools

Background & Introduction

In Uttarakhand state, there are 13 Districts. It has a Population of 84.89 lakhs. Out of the Total Population, SC & ST constitute 15.7%, which in numbers is 2.56 lakhs respectively. The government has started the Scheme for providing education to the children of SC & ST community by providing Grant –in-Aid to the Schools. This scheme is going on in all the districts. This scheme is for the SC/ ST children and is implemented by the NGOs. The NGOs have opened the schools in which they conduct classes from class 1 to class 8. Apart from the schools of the education department the department of welfare is also providing primary education to the children through the NGOs.

Objectives of Schemes

The main objective of the scheme is to educate the illiterate SC/ ST children in the primary classes and make them capable to go to the junior school (for higher studies) which would enable them to become a part of the main stream.

Main Objectives :

- **To Educate illiterate SC/ST children in primary school so that they become competent to go to junior School**
- **Assistance given to NGOs for running schools so as to educate the SC/ ST children in primary schools in all the districts of Uttarakhand**
- **Assistance given to schools to educate SC/ ST children upto 8th class so that they become competent to go to Junior schools**

Scheme Details :

- Primary schools having more than 50% SC/ ST students are provided assistance
- 1 teacher has to be appointed for every 40 children
- 1 more teacher to be appointed for 20 additional children
- The school has been into existence for more than 10 years and is registered with the District Education office as permanent or Temporary school
- Remuneration of teachers is to be given as per the approved amount from the department

Scope of the scheme

Under the scheme the aided schools should have atleast 50% children from the SC/ST community. The student teacher ratio should be 40. For 40 children there should be one principal and for additional 20 children 1 teacher can be appointed. The aid would be given to the schools which have been running for last 10 years and is recognised permanently or temporarily by the education department. The salary of the teachers would be decided as per the government norms.
